pread over six districts covering an area of 13,017.6 Sq.Kms and bounded by Nepal in East, Tibet in North, Garhwal region and Uttar Pradesh in south-west, Kumaon, a jewel of the glittering Himalayan necklace, is a land resplendent in awesome natural splendour.

Situated between the latitude 28°44' and 30°49' North and longitude 78°45' and 81°1' East, Kumaon is a land resplendent in awesome natural splendor.




Beginning from 250 meters above sea level and rising upto 7800 meters above sea level, its endless panorama of scenic wonders is nothing short of romance with pristine and soul- lifting nature itself.

Climate

Winter in Kumaon start from November-December to mid March, Spring from mid March–April, Summer from May-June, Monsoons from July- September & autumn from late September to early November. Average rainfall varies from 90 to 250 cms and 70% of the rainfall occurs between July-September. There is snowfall in lesser Himalayas during winter.

It is believed that the word "Kumaon" is derived from "Kurmanchal", which means the land of Kurmavatar (the tortoise incarnation of Lord Vishnu, Preserver of the Hindu Trinity).

Well-connected to different parts of the country, Kumaon hills are a treasure-house for the tourists, trekkers and pilgrims alike.





Kumaon - The Lake Country

All the lakes boast of spectacular view and breathtaking scenery. Lakes of Kumaon pride itself with its friendly people who are there to ensure that you and your family have a great during your stay with them. Water sports like angling, boating, kayaking, canoeing and other activities are also offered to provide you and your whole family alternatives in enjoying your stay in Kumaon.

Nainital (A gem in perfect setting, graceful willows encircle the emerald mountain lake, surrounding hill-ranges and the overlooking peaks, give to her the added charm of wilderness), Bhimtal (Named after one of the five Pandva Brothers, it is one of the largest lake in Kumaon region), Sat Tal (Seven small but exquisite lakes, including Pania, Nal-Damyanti, Sita, Ram, Laxman and Sukha tal - in the midest of thick, tall pine oak trees), Naukuchiyatal (The nine cornered lake lake ideal for fishing and watching migratory birds), Khurpatal (A real paradise for anglers, the lake is inhabitated by numerous fishes and is surrounded be green terraced fields], Shyamaltal (The blue coloured lake) are some of the prominent lakes in Kumaon.











Kumaon - The Wild Adventure



Unique mysterious and forever fascinating the region of Kumaon spans a diverse variety of geographical terrain which are veritable treasure house for animals and birds.

Right from the lofty mountains perennially under a thick blanket of snow, to the wide basin of Ganges valley, from the undulating highlands to the isolated hillocks, one finds a fascinating diversity of wild life.

Corbett National Park

Kumaon takes you to the adventurous tour of India's first and finest National Park Jim Corbett National Park. A paradise on earth, nestling between two sub-Himalayan foothill range, it is famous for its tigers, elephants and birds. Dedicated to the cause of wildlife and named after legendary hunter Jim Corbett, Jim Corbett National Park is nothing less than a paradise on earth. Spread over an area of 520 sq km along bank of Ram Ganges river, mother nature has really bestowed the Corbett with an unparalleled beauty and superb magnificence.

The elevation of park ranges from 400 meter to 1100 meter and the highest point offers a breathtaking view of the park.

Binsar Sanctuary

Binsar is bird watchers paradise. The bird life of Himalayan station is a fixed quantity since the migration of Indian birds is undoubtedly intricate and varied. Base Camp - Dharchula

Mount Adi-Kailash also known as Chhota Kailash, is an ancient holy place in Kumaon Himalaya, similar to Mount Kailash in Tibet. It is situated close to the Indo Tibet border in Pithoragarh district. The trek begins and ends at Tawaghat. The first seven days trek is on the same route as the pilgrimage to Mount Kailash and Mansarovar. In the vast village in this valley, Kuti, one gets to see Pandav fort, natural salt mines and intricately engraved doors and windows of the



Base Camp - Bageshwar

The most accessible glacier in Kumaon Region, Pindari is located at 3820mts in Patti Malla Danpur of Almora district. The Pindari glacier is 3kms long and 1.5kms wide and is connected to the southwestern slope of the outer wall of the Nanda Devi Sanctuary. The main peaks near the glacier are Nandakot (6880mts.), Nandakhat (6611mts.), Pawalidwar (6663mts.), Balijuri (5922mts.) and Changuch (6322mts.). The picturesque route to Pindari glacier has KMVN rest houses at convenient sites all along up to Phurkia. The distance from Delhi to Kathgodam (280kms), Kathgodam to Saung (215kms) by bus. From Saung to Pindari glacier is as 45km's trek.

Base Camp - Bageshwar

The Kafni glacier lies towards the left of Pindari valley below Nandakot. The tranquility prevailing in this region has a special charm. It is also rich in wildlife. The main peaks near the glacier are Nandakot(6860mts.) and Nanda Bhanar(6104mts). The route to Pindari and Kafni glacier is common up to Dwali. The distance from Saung to Kafni is a 38 kms trek.

PANCHHACHULI (9 Days)

Base Camp - Dharchula

Nestling snugly in the lap of the snow capped peaks of Panchachuli, the Darma valley in Pithoragarh district is endowed with abundant scenic grandeur. Sobla bus terminal is 134kms from Pithoragarh and 35 kilometres from Dharchula and is the last bus terminal From Sobla to Panchachuli Glacier is a 40 kms trek. The route to the glacier abounds in exotic scenery, snowcapped mountains, gushing streams, alpine meadows and a rich variety of flora and fauna. Juniper, Blue flowers, Edelweiss etc. are found enroute to the trek.

MILAM GLACIER(7 Days)

Base Camp - Munsyari
The base camp for Milam Glacier in
Munsiyari (2290mts.) in Pithoragarh
district. The Milam glacier summit at
3872mts in the nodal point for a different
high grade routes and peaks. The main peaks
are Hardeol (7151mts.), Burphudhura
(6215mts.) and Kalabulanddhura
(6215mts.). Shrubs with creamy white,
orange, yellow & pink flowers, Juniper, Blue
flowers, Aconitum, large variety of flowers,
Rooki, Primula, Yellow flowered berberis,
Bugyals are found enroute to the Milam.


NANDA DEVI (EAST) (7 Days)

Base Camp - Munsyari

Nanda Devi (East) Base Camp is the most exciting Himalayan trek cum expedition. The treks along Gori Ganga river up to Reilkot. From Reilkot to Martoli is 7kms. Nanda Devi (East) base camp situated at Bhiltalgwar 4350mts below Nanda Devi and one can see trail pass Nanda Ghunti and long stuff peaks. Nanda devi base camp is about 63Kms from Munsiyari.



Kumaon - The God's Own Country



Kumaon has rich historical past which dates back to the early advent of Kol, Kirat and shaka dynasties. Interestingly enough the Buddhist religion went to Tibet via this very region and its presence in Kumaon is borne out by the archaelogical ruins near Senapani.

There are also accounts of Yuan Chavang (Huen Tsang) describing the woman rulers of Katyuri dynasty of 6th AD and remnants of Chand dynasty upto 16th AD.

Although Lord Shiva's influence prevailed through out Kumaon, mainly because of its proximity to the region of Panchkendras and Kailash Mansarovar, this did not in any way hamper the influence of Local folk Gods and Goddesses.

The Kumaon region is dotted with ancient temples and pilgrims center. On the auspicious occasions, these centers of faith turn into venues of fascinating festivals, when people from far and wide gather there to offer their obeisance to the deity and give musical expression to their joy and happiness.




The Himalayas from times immemorial have attracted one and all. The Kedar and Manas Khands of Skanda Purana are dedicated entirely to the glorifications of Himalayas. The sheer beauty of the enchanting nature on the way to Kailash Mansarovar, the adobe of Shiva, compels one to forget the arduous trek that they have to undertake to reach them. Kailash Mansarovar Yatra is considered to be the holiest religious act by Hindus, Jains and Tibetians alike. The Yatra provide such serene and soothing vibrations that pilgrims from far and wide are attracted in search of enlightment. Mount Kailash, which is believed to have been formed 30 million years ago, when Himalayas were in their early stages of formation, is one of the most revered places in the Himalayas.

Four great Himalayan rivers, including the mighty Brahmaputra, have their sources near Mt. Kailash, adding to its sanctity. Mt. Kailash is also believed to be the adobe of Shiva and Parvati.

Spread out on the Tibetan plateau beside Mount Kailsah is the giant lake of Shifting colours Lake Mansarovar. A pilgrimage to Mount Kailash and a bath in the Mansarovar is believed to bring about salvation or moksha.

The various activities for water sports which can be organized in this reservoir are Water skiing, yatching, Boating, Canoing, Kyaking, Wet parasailing etc. The large size of the reservoir is suitable for water sports activities throughout the year.
